



Recipes enjoyed from around the globe not only serve delicious food, but also bring us knowledge and understanding of different cultures and their history. Oven-baked dishes are practical and accessible and are also a healthier option rather than fried food. These simple oven-baked dishes are sure to keep you busy in the kitchen and bring diverse tastes and traditions to your home!

1. Egyptian Feteer Meshaltet

Feteer Meshaltet is a popular Egyptian pastry made with multiple layers of pastry dough and butter. It is said that the feteer was what inspired the well-known french pastry known as the croissant today. It represents the hospitality and affection which can be seen in its people and its culture. Feteer Meshaltet is found in cafes and restaurants all over the country. This soft and delicious pastry can be eaten with condiments such as jam, cream or even just plain. Comforting and warm to eat, the Feteer Meshaltet is a definite must-have!





2. German Pfeffernüsse

Known for its delicious baked goods, Germany never fails to provide us with tasty baked recipes. The German Pfeffernüsse is a spiced and iced cookie made with Lebkuchengewürz, a traditional german gingerbread spice blend. Because butter was scarce and oranges were abundant, this butterless and citrus-filled cake became a sweet saviour during those difficult times. It can be served for breakfast, dessert and more commonly, paired with the famous Moroccan tea for a delectable snack. Meskouta is the most refreshing and extremely moist cake and is rarely served with icing due to the incredible flavour it brings!



6. Nigerian Meat Pies

Nigerian meat pies are pockets of pastry with a meat filling. The pastry is soft and flaky and the filling is moist and flavoursome. Influenced by cornish pasties during the British colonization, Nigerian meat pies have evolved into a signature West African dish full of rich flavour, culture, and history. 



7. Palestinian Spinach Fatayer




Mexico



What are your thoughts on this generation war, should it cease to exist, or do you enjoy watching this generation gap unfold?






FLASHBACK: Your elementary school teacher just announced that the whole class will be watching an episode of Bill Nye the Science Guy. Everyone's ecstatic. Times were simpler then. After all, who doesn't love that amazing scientific communicator? Wait... scientific communicator? Bill Nye?

It's true! He is the beloved star of one of the most famous science communication productions ever. Yet many people are unaware of that aspect. In fact, many people don't know what science communication even is! A 2016 study funded by NASA and conducted by the University of Michigan found that only 28 percent of Americans possess adequate comprehension skills to understand current scientific subject matter.

Clearly, public scientific literacy is substandard. How can we overcome this? Ironically, the answer lies in scientific communication itself.

Scientific communication simply involves the ability to effectively explain scientific concepts to the public or other scientists. Effective communication means delivering



information concisely and clearly, no matter the target audience. However, depending on the audience, different levels of comprehension must be considered. To accomplish this, we can ask ourselves: can content consumers grasp the concept with ease? Additionally, to engage the audience, the message must be presented in a way that is contextual and exciting. Accurate representation of information is also crucial, and avoiding extreme simplification is key. Too much simplification can lead to incorrect assumptions, most notable in the early stages of the pandemic, where many online sources compared COVID-19 severity to the flu. Concise delivery should be the main priority when communicating anything.



Spreading the definition of science communication can help clarify the importance of it. Scientific communication is powerful. Exhibiting compelling communication will result in a greater ability to reach a wider audience, leading to better collaboration and innovation overall. This wider audience can consist of the general public or even minorities who traditionally lack access to scientific resources, allowing a spotlight to be cast on science and related issues. Since research is interdisciplinary, sending a coherent message to people across various areas of knowledge can help scientists spread their viewpoints to

other scientists, the public, or other professionals. For instance, to combat falsehoods on climate change, many sources promote a scientifically accurate explanation of the issue, including government campaigns, credible works, and educating content. Arguably, the most significant impact science communication has on the public is the capability to limit misinformation and fake news. The past few years have demonstrated the sheer influence of false information, whether that be COVID-19 conspiracy theories or misrepresentation in the election. Using science communication to inform non-scientists can raise a better understanding in society of the credibility science has. This will garner more support for science in general, leading to the application of scientific knowledge in fields like policymaking.

Well, you now know that Bill Nye the Science Guy was a science communication show. But where else is science literacy promoted? Research papers, viewpoints, essays, videos, podcasts, and social media content are all examples of science communication content. These examples can be used to inform other fellow scientists, daily citizens, or both.

From dissertations to tweets, scientific communication is everywhere. But how can one gain experience and knowledge by actively participating in the creation of scientific communication content? After all, BR students aren't scientists (yet)! Unfortunately, most science communication programs are tailored to those participating in higher education. To provide more opportunities for high school students to learn about this field, I am planning to run a workshop series focusing on just that! Through my organization "Speak Your Piece", I will provide a concise introduction to scientific literacy and communication, along with guidance on creating science communication content. Straws, plastic bags and plastic water bottles are all examples of the single-use plastics that are constantly being used and then improperly disposed of across Canada. Here are some quick facts that will blow your mind:

- Over 56 million straws are used by Canadians every day
- Almost 15 billion (you read that right... billion!) plastic bags are used by Canadians alone each year
- Every year, Canadians throw away 3 million tonnes worth of plastic and less than
 10% is actually recycled
- As a result, 29,000 tonnes of plastic ends up in the environment

THE ULTIMATE dairy alternatives

If someone were to tell you that the milk you drink and put in your cereal is a contributor to climate change, would you believe them? The answer is probably not. For the longest time, I didn't think much about the milk I drank either until I made a New

Year resolution to be more eco-conscious.

One of the first things I changed about my lifestyle was my diet. I had previous knowledge that dairy from cows was not the best for the environment because of the methane cows produce, so I started to look for alternatives. Along with cow's milk, I've also had almond milk and naturally, I thought that I would just switch over to almond milk, which would solve the eco-friendly milk problem.

To make one litre of cow's milk, 1050 litres of water is needed. Finally, the land required in the making of dairy milk is astronomical. With 270 million dairy cows, the land needed for production is incredible.

In terms of greenhouse gas emissions for oat milk, 200ml glass is responsible for around 0.18kg of CO2e. Oat milk uses only 48 litres of water which is comparatively less to other alternatives on the list. Finally, oats use 80% less land to grow than dairy milk requires.

Coming in second is soy milk. A 200ml glass of soy milk is responsible for around 0.195kg of CO2e, and one litre of soy milk needs 297 litres of water to produce. The main issue with soy milk is the land required in the production. More specifically, large parts of the Amazon rainforest are being cut down for soy plantations and production.

However, I was shocked to find out that almond milk and other dairy alternatives are harmful to the environment. Milk is a large part of many people's diets, and if we keep consuming it at the rate we do now, we are just accelerating the pace of climate change. I want to rank dairy alternatives from least to most harmful based on greenhouse gas emissions, water consumption in production, and land use.

First, I want to lay out the stats for cow's milk as a base for comparing the alternatives. The greenhouse gas emissions for one glass are around 0.6kg per 200 ml glass. As I mentioned before, cows are a significant methane producer, which is around 20x more potent than carbon dioxide as a greenhouse gas.

The final dairy alternative, and possibly the worst for the environment, is almond milk. While almond milk produces a lesser amount of greenhouse gas emissions than soy milk or cow milk (0.14kg of CO2e/200 ml glass), they use more land and water than soy, cow's, or oat milk, and on average need 14.5 litres of water to grow one almond!

Climate change has become a magnified issue in the past few years, and when I made a promise to myself on January 1st, 2021, that I would be more conscious in the choices I make to respect the environment more, I was overwhelmed. I started small, like really small, by changing the type of milk I drank. It's easy to care for our planet and maybe you can use my ranking on milk alternatives as inspiration to get started...

 - 5 pipettes
 - 1 stand

 - 3 painting spatulas

- . Pick out your colours and make sure to include white as one of them
- 2. Get different cups for each colour and pour some paint into each
- 3. Using the pipette drop 2-3 drops of silicone oil in each cup and mix
- 4. Pour your colours into one cup and make sure to add white on the bottom and middle, DO NOT MIX
- 5. Grab your canvas and place it on top of the cup then flip it over
- 6. Pick up the cup and make sure all the paint is out
- 7. Move the canvas around to cover all areas
- 8. Optional: add glitter
- 9. Let it dry and now you're done!

Tips:

- 1. Pick colors that will complement each other For example, blue and purple
- Don't hesitate when deciding how much paint to put it's better to have more than less
- 3. Need a video explanation look here: Acrylic Pour Painting

- White paint


Steps:

THE TRUTH BEHIND the grammys

For the past 63 years, the Grammys has been the greatest music award show of all time. Although many may agree, The Recording Academy has received extensive backlash which even includes accusations of gender discrimination, influencing of award winners, sexual harassment allegations, racial bias, and the award show all in all being "rigged" and "corrupt".

Behind the scenes of the fancy production and organized show, the industry is waging a war for the soul of the Grammys. In January of 2020, Deborah Dugan, former CEO of the Recording Academy, filed a discrimination lawsuit against her former employer, Neil Portnow. The legal complaint consisted of 46 pages and included allegations of gender discrimination, sexual conduct, and corruption in the Academy. Due to these allegations, many viewers are now in doubt and mistrust of the award system, which is supposedly reserved as musics' highest honor.



More recently, popular RnB artist, The Weeknd, released his new project "After Hours" in March of 2020, which has sold 460,000 copies and has racked up more than 1.7 billion streams — enough to make it the third-most-consumed album of the year. His hit song from the album "Blinding Lights" had broken chart records and drove high critical acclaim. He also performed in the halftime super bowl show in February of 2021, a great deal in the music industry. Yet, when it came to Grammy nominations, The Weeknd got nothing. The Academy's decision not to nominate any of his albums left shock waves throughout the music industry. The Weeknd being as disappointed and angry as many viewers were, tweeted, telling his 13.5 million followers, "The Grammys remain corrupt. You owe me, my fans and the industry transparency."

However, the Weeknd is not the only artist to be let down by the Grammys. In 2005, popular hip hop artist Kanye West was let down not once, but twice. Firstly, he lost the "Best New Artist" award to: Maroon 5and the secondly his song "Jesus Walks" was defeated for the "Song of The Year" award by John Mayer's "Daughters".





Many other black artists have also felt the racial bias standard the Grammys have set, specifically in the 2020 Grammys. Tyler The Creator had just won best rap album for his 2019 release "Igor", and while he was stilled pumped up and got to talking backstage with interviewers he expresses his dissatisfaction regarding the category, "It sucks that whenever we — and I mean guys that look like me — do anything that's genre-bending they always put it in a 'rap' or 'urban' category," he said. "I don't like that 'urban' word — it's just a politically correct way to say the n-word to me. ... Half of me feels like the rap nomination was just a backhanded compliment. Like, my little cousin wants to play the game. Let's give him the unplugged controller so he can shut up and feel good about it." Hip-hop and R&B artists account for more than 30% of all music streaming activity, more than double the next nearest genres (rock and pop at 14 percent each). However, it wasn't until 2014 that the Grammys allowed samples — a staple of hip-hop composition — to participate in songwriting categories, including song of the year.

Whether or not the Grammys are rigged, they still seem to be a lost cause when it comes to judging the most important contemporary music. Hip-hop, in particular, is sometimes viewed as though it were a passing fad or novelty, rather than an art form that has been evolving and redefining mainstream music for more than four decades. All I know is that if key artists aren't getting their fair share at the Grammys, the fans may tune out for good.

ALL ABOUT "FEARLESS (tayloris version)"

It's likely you've listened to some of Taylor Swift's chart-topping singles, such as "Love Story" or "You Belong with Me", which are some of the artist's highest-grossing songs. These are some notable title's from her album Fearless. Fearless is Taylor Swift's second and most successful studio album, released in 2008. The album as a whole was her initial breakthrough into the music industry and won a total of 4 Grammy's and was named Album of the Year in 2010.



Taylor Swift's first 6 albums (in order): Taylor Swift, Fearless, Speak Now, Red, 1989 and Lover were recorded by Big Machine Records. After leaving the record label for Republic Records in 2019, the masters of her first six albums and the rights to most of her work were acquired by Scooter Braun, the owner of Big Machine Records in 2019.

Swift attempted and was unable to gain ownership of the master recordings, which Braun claimed was incorrect, and that she had had the opportunity to purchase them. Taylor Swift said herself in a Twitter post on November 16th, 2020 "These master recordings were not for sale to me." In either case, the deal offered to Swift was reported to be highly unfavourable to the artist, contingent on her signing of another long-term contract.



After the significant controversy surrounding the ownership, Taylor Swift decided to re-record her first 6 albums, entitling them "Taylor's Version", which will be fully owned by her. She chose to begin the re-recordings starting with what was her second studio album, Fearless which was announced on Twitter on February 11th, 2021. Swift told her followers, "I'm thrilled to tell you that my new version of Fearless is done and will be with you soon. It's called Fearless (Taylor's Version) and it includes 26 songs. I've spoken a lot about why I'm remaking my first six albums, but the way I've chosen to do this will hopefully help illuminate where I'm coming from. Artists should own their own work for so many reasons, but the most screamingly obvious one is that the artist is the only one who really *knows* that body of work."



The new Fearless will include all of the album's original discography, as well as some never-before-seen songs that never made it into the final copy of the album. The first single released was "Love Story (Taylor's Version)," on the day after the re-recording was announced, on February 12th. The next single released was "You All Over Me (From the Vault)" an unreleased song that was not included in the original album, and debuted for the first time on March 26th.


Thirteen years after the album's initial release, and after Swift has shifted through genres growing and maturing as an artist, it's exciting to see the classic songs from a new perspective. The highly anticipated release date of the new album was not officially released, but predicted from a secret series of emphasized letters in her February 11st twitter post (attached here) spelling out "APRIL NINTH" leading fans to anticipate its release then.

Teenagers Learning to Find Their Voice in Morie (Stranshalahane, Grade 1)

Trigger Warning: This article contains mention of sexual assault

On March 3, 2021, Netflix released a movie called *Moxie*. This Netflix Original directed by Amy Poehler stars Hadley Robinson, Patrick Schwarzenegger, Alycia Pascual-Peña, Nico Hiraga and many more! The movie was released right in time for Women's History Month since it focuses on Gen Z feminism. It can be seen as a source of inspiration for many female teenagers to speak out and stand up against gender inequality.

What is Moxie?

Moxie follows the life of a teenage girl named Vivian (Hadley Robinson). Vivian is inspired by her mother's (Amy Poehler) rebellious past and the riot grrrl era of the '90s, from Bikini Kill (the punk rock feminist band) to call out sexism at her high school. Vivian observed the new girl Lucy (Alycia Pascual-Peña) getting harassed by the "popular jock" Mitchell (Patrick Schwarzenegger) for speaking her mind. Vivian made the decision to start a feminist movement after a list was posted that objectified girls at the school by ranking them based on appearances. The school staff did not take any action against the list so Vivian took matters into her own hands. She begins by anonymously creating zines titled "Moxie" and stocking them in all the girls washrooms throughout the school to raise awareness about the issue. Girls throughout the school start by holding silent protests such as doodling on their arms to show support or wearing crop tops to go against sexist dress policies. These protests inspired girls to raise their voices and speak out on how they have been affected by the sexist administration and boorish behavious of boys at their school. Team captain Kiera (Sydney Park) and her team brought home more wins on the girls' soccer team than the boys' football team but they do not get nearly as much recognition. A transgender girl, CJ (Josie Totah), is not allowed to audition for a female role in the school play and Caitlin (Sabrina Haskett) gets sent home for wearing a tanktop. The feminist movement takes over the school and a cheerleader and Emma (Josephine Langford), anonymously writes to the creator of the Moxie zines. In the note, she writes that she was sexually assaulted by Mitchell but the guarterback did not face consequences for his actions since his father had covered it up. The next issue of Moxie included the anonymous note and this caused an outrage leading to a walkout to protest the corrupt administration.

At the walkout, Vivian reveals herself as the author of Moxie and many other girls take turns to step up and talk about how the school has treated them unjustly. The Moxie movement proves to be successful as the movie ends with the resignation of the sexist prinicpal (Marcia Gay Harden) and Mitchell having to finally pay for his actions.



Moxie's Interesting Use of Characters

The stereotypical characters of the mean jock, Mitchell, and ignorant principal, Principal Shelley, created a very toxic dynamic within the school which helped portray the severity of the issue. As well as, the refreshing character of the supportive boyfriend, Seth played by Nico Hiraga. Seth is a great addition to the movie as he was not blinded by the illusion Mitchell had created within the school of inducing popularity by violating girls. This is crucial because in high school, those who are left out just want to fit in but they end up following a wrong example set by the popular crowd without realizing it.

Where Moxie Missed the Mark...

Moxie had an amazing message however, it lacked a certain perspective of women of colour. Although the cast is very diverse, the movie is mostly centered around the character of Vivian. Claudia's reluctance causes conflict between her and her best friend, Vivian, since Claudia's intentions are misunderstood. 


Instructions For Dancing by Nicolia yoon




The Chosen and the Beautiful by Nghi Vo

The Prison Healer by Lynette Noni


Release date: March 30, 2021 Genre: Fantasy, Romance


A Court of Thorns and Roses



We Hunt The Flame





The book is the heartbreaking yet enlightening origin story of the Queen of Hearts and how Cath came to be the villain we know today. It opens the reader's heart towards the villain, and we find a newfound respect for her. The story does not start off as tragic; in fact, the opposite, entirely innocent and light. In the wondrous land of Wonderland, Cath, daughter of nobility, just dreams of opening a bakery with her best friend/maid, Mary Ann, and marrying for love rather than accept a proposal from the short and wimpy King of Hearts, especially after meeting the handsome and mysterious court jester, Jest. But to her mother, such dreams are unthinkable for the young woman who could be the next queen. Catherine is a desired girl in Wonderland and a favorite of the King of Hearts. Still, her interests lie elsewhere because when Cath meets Jest for the first time, she feels the pull of true love. Jest and her enter an intense, secret courtship at the risk of offending the King and infuriating her parents. The story is placed in a period before Alice in Wonderland and Alice Through the Looking Glass, so we also get to read some other backstories of other important characters, such as the Mad Hatter. Cath is determined to define her own destiny and fall in love with someone she truly adores, but in a land thriving with magic, madness, and monsters, fate has other plans.

If you love romance, fantasy, and fictional books, this is the book for you, that is if you do not mind a sad ending. There are tons of twists and turns. The text is full of love, humour, happiness, sadness, and a bit of betrayal. There's a rollercoaster of emotions and a wide range of character personalities that evolve as you read the book. Marissa Meyer has done an outstanding job in writing this book and how well she describes the story. You can clearly picture Wonderland in your mind as you're reading the book and can make connections with this book and Alice in Wonderland. The way she portrays how Cath, a teenage girl, feels as she faces



these obstacles or falls in love for the first time is really well done and is relatable to the teenagers reading the book. The author's process of writing this, her first standalone novel, was different from that of writing The Lunar Chronicles series as she says, "It was a completely different process! Perhaps the only real similarity between writing Heartless and The Lunar Chronicles is that they both had these classic source materials to draw on for inspiration (Alice in Wonderland and fairy tales). Still, even that was different, in that writing fairy tale retellings requires you to follow the known plot at least to some degree. In contrast, Alice provided an endpoint for the events in Heartless but very little guidance as to what the story or plot should be. And, of course, the worlds are about as opposite as they could get - from the very technology-heavy world of the Lunar Chronicles and inspirations taken from multiple real-world cultures to the fantastical, slightly Victorian England-based world of Wonderland, in which the more ridiculous something is, the better!" When Marissa Meyer was asked how her readers responded to Cath, she replied by saying that, "I've really loved hearing from readers who tell me that Cath's story has given them an entirely new perspective on the Queen of Hearts... That feels like an amazing accomplishment as a writer, and of course, was something that I was hoping to achieve in writing this origin story of such a well-known villain!" I agree with these readers because "before she was the Queen of Hearts, she was just a girl who wanted to fall in love."

The best easter eggs in WANDAVISION

Simser Paint (Episode 3)

Fans originally thought that the use of the word "sim" was a reference to the mysterious simulation that Wanda and Vision were in. However, this is probably not the case. This is most likely a reference to Jeremy Simser, the storyboard artist on WandaVision. Jeremy Simser is also working on Doctor Strange in the Multiverse of Madness. This could be an indication of WandaVision having something to do with Doctor Strange in the future of the MCU.

Skrulls (Episode 4)

In WandaVision, Wanda's sons were encouraging her to do the same for their poor dog after he died.



Halloween Costumes (Episode 6)

When Wanda and her family dress up for Halloween in their costumes, many fans did not notice that Wanda and Vision were literally wearing their original outfits in the early stages of the Marvel Comics Universe. The outfit Quicksilver wears is also the same as his original character design.



Tombstone (Episode 6)

Wanda flings Pietro across the square and he flies past a fake tombstone for Janell Sammelman, who was originally the first assistant director of WandaVision.



In the opening credits, there are many images of Wanda's name written in different places and there is one shot with Wanda's name on a license plate. There is a number on top of the license plate: 122822. This can also be seen as the date January 28th, 1922, which is Stan Lee's (the creator of Marvel) birthday!



The Brady Bunch Episode (Episode 8)

You can clearly see an episode of the classic television show in Wanda's flashbacks of her life. The episode that is playing is called "Kitty Karry-all Is Missing." The reason this episode is used in WandaVision is that the plot resembles Wanda's current situation. 


COVID-19 outhreak AT MILTON'S MAPLEHURST JAIL

There is no doubt that the COVID-19 pandemic has irreversible consequences on the mental health of Canadians. According to the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH), 50% percent of Canadians report worsening mental health since the beginning of the pandemic. These figures are disconcerting, and unfortunately, these mental health challenges intensify where treatment is most hostile— in prisons. Maplehurst is a correctional complex here in Milton. Over the last few months, COVID-19 cases have skyrocketed within the facility. The measures used to combat the outbreak are doing more harm than good to the inmates.

CBC covered the facility's situation earlier this year through insiders' eyes— the families of inmates as well as lawyers. Their article gives insight into how mental health in prisons is being overlooked, especially during the pandemic.



From mid-January to February 3, 2021, when the article was published, 116 inmates and 59 staff members tested positive for COVID-19. That is a total of 175 positive cases in a population of roughly 1500, which according to "The Star", is the highest amount of cases in all correctional facilities across Ontario. By the end of January, the Ontario Government decided that Maplehurst will not accept any more inmates. The facility was placed in complete lockdown.

The lockdown measures as described by the Government are standard and seem normal at first. They include; testing inmates, separating positive cases from the general population for a required isolation period and, increased cleaning protocols. However, as the CBC article,"'Family members and lawyers alike in the dark as COVID-19 outbreak rages at Milton jail" uncovers, these measures go way beyond that, to the point where it has impacted the mental well-being of inmates and those connected to them.



One mother of an inmate at Maplehurst is hoping to get in touch with her son, as he has tested positive for COVID-19. They have not spoken to each other in almost two weeks. She says she is worried about her son's condition. Insiders have said that isolation cells are packed full of COVID-positive inmates. Many inmates have not been able to shower or leave their cells for a couple of weeks, and there is no one to reach out to to get help because access to phones is limited. The lack of communication between the prison, inmate families, and council is causing significant stress. Inmates are also experiencing declining mental health, becoming anxious locked in their cells all day, a feeling which most of us can relate to.

With Maplehurst being so close to home for us, we can see the impacts of COVID-19 on Canadians' the mental health and how it affects not only the individual but also their family. Unfortunately, because prisons are so disconnected from the world, it is not easy to see the rapid decline in mental health. According to a study by CAMH, "mental illness rates are about 4 to 7 times more common in prison than in the community". Let us imagine how much more noticeable declines in mental health right now when they are more isolated and cannot access resources to help. While mental health may get overlooked among the stress of the pandemic and continuous lockdowns, it is especially overlooked in prisons.

Over the past few months, about any Canadian resident can safely say that the country has shown a predominant role in supporting India's farmer protests. What began as a major issue in the rural areas of Punjab, Haryana, and Uttar Pradesh has now evolved into an international fight for the rights of Indian farmers.

Since November 26 of last year, thousands of farmers have been camping at several Delhi border points demanding an immediate repeal of three implemented farm laws - Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation)Act, 2020; the Farmers Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and farm Services Act 2020 and the Essential Commodities (Amendment) Act, 2020. Under the previous laws, farmers sold their goods at auction at their state's Agricultural Produce Market Committee, however, under the three new laws, farmers can sell their goods at any price they'd like. The issue with this is that the laws can allow big companies to drive down prices, which means farmers do not have the guarantee of earning minimum prices for their goods. This is inevitably driving the farmers out of business.





The continuation of the protests throughout the past few months have been difficult on the entire nation of India. The majority of protestors and leaders have admitted to wanting a peaceful resolution, however, some protests have led to violence between the Indian government and its protestors. On January 26, India's Republic Day, one protestor was left dead with hundreds of others injured. The protests have even made their way internationally to Canada, in heavily-Indian populated places such as Brampton ON, and Surrey BC.

Thousands of Canadians have been attending protests and car rallies, and Prime Minister Trudeau has backed up the rights of farmers to peacefully protest numerous times.

Unfortunately, the laws are taking their toll on the farmers of India, lodging them into debt and bankruptcy. Debt and bankruptcy are considered a root cause for suicide and is highlighted in the government's data which shows livelihood to be a leading cause of despair in India. The latest data from the National Crime Records Bureau shows more than 10,000 farmers and agricultural labourers killed themselves in 2019 (Shivji, 2021). That is 7.4 percent of India's total suicide victims which means an average of 28 suicides in India's farming community each day. This is very alarming, and it is clear to see why protesters around the world are enraged by the Indian government's decisions.

Numerous celebrities have taken advantage of their large social media following to help raise awareness for this underlying issue. Priyanka Chopra took to Twitter stating "Our farmers are India's Food Soldiers. Their fears need to be allayed. Their hopes need to be met. As a thriving democracy, we must ensure that this crisis is resolved sooner than later." Famous Bollywood Actress Sonam Kapoor quoted Daniel Webster tweeting "When tillage begins, other arts follow. The farmers, therefore, are the founders of human civilization." Furthermore, inspiring Bollywood Actor Riteish Deshmukh wrote "If you eat today, thank a farmer. I stand in solidarity with every farmer in our country. #JaiKisaan." India's greatest names are coming together to stand in solidarity with the farmers against the Indian government, which truly shows how significant of an issue this is.

The protests are continuing and it seems that neither sides have been able to come to an agreement. The government has held 11 rounds of talks, however, the farmers nor the government have reached a final decision. We can only hope that both sides can come to a reasonable agreement and help end the emotional suffering that the Indian farmers are going through.

FACEBOOK LIFTS BAN ON political ADVERTISING

Many of the most popular social media apps, such as Instagram, Tiktok, and Twitter, can be found on the internet. You probably use these apps on a regular basis, and have most likely seen advertisements when doing so. Believe me, we've all seen them, from advertisements that try to convince you to purchase the latest items to those attempting to persuade you to believe certain things. You might have also seen ads promoting a certain politician/party and asking for your vote.

These are known as campaign ads, and they are used to manipulate a national discussion by targeting voters via media sources. Although they may be useful in certain situations, they can also propagate confusion and cause conflict. These ads are constantly visible on Twitter, Instagram, Youtube, and Google. In reality, some of these tech giants have a long history of secretly blocking these kinds of advertising. So, let's take a look at what people think about Facebook's latest decision to lift the ban on political ads!

On March 4, Facebook announced that it would restart national, electoral, and social issue advertising in the United States. The ban was put in place to avoid the spread of misleading information and inflaming voters during the November 3rd election. In a blog post, Facebook said, "We placed this temporary ban in effect after the November 2020 election to prevent misunderstanding or harassment after Election Day." Facebook's campaign ad restriction has been in effect since the Nov. 3 election, with the exception of the Senate runoffs in Georgia in January. So, how long has this prohibition been in existence and why is it being lifted?

During the 2016 presidential election, U.S. business intelligence officials learned that Russians had used Facebook advertisements to spread discord among Americans. Former President Donald J. Trump has used Facebook campaign advertisements to amplify claims of a 2019 "invasion" on the Mexican border, among many other things. Every political season, major platforms find that voter enragement and disinformation are common issues which is why they planned to impose a temporary ban on campaign advertising.




In an attempt to fight disinformation, Facebook and Google, which together received more than \$3 billion in campaign spending during the 2020 election cycle, implemented political and issue-advocacy ad bans around the general election. Furthermore, many nations, including the United Kingdom, Ireland, and the European Union, have either outlawed or severely limited television campaign advertisements. On Oct. 27, the week before the election, Facebook started accepting new political or topic advertising. "We appreciate how critical it is for candidates to run get-out-the-vote campaigns, but there might not be enough time to challenge new arguments in the final days of an election," Mark Zuckerberg said. Many people believed the ban was appropriate, given the amount of disinformation posted on social media after the last election and the violent assault on the United States Capitol on January 6. Commercial advertisements are okay, according to an Atlanta reporter, but campaign ads that "can be used to sway elections and change the lives of millions" are not.

However, the ban had a negative effect on companies and policymakers. The Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee and the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee released a statement condemning Facebook for failing to agree to a specific date for lifting the suspension, claiming that the moratorium had made it more difficult for candidates and groups to contact voters.

Americans have voiced their frustration with political ad bans on the most open outlets, arguing that it tilts the playing field in favour of candidates who can afford radio and television. Senator Ted Cruz recently argued, "Incumbent lawmakers have plenty of money and a massive megaphone to spread their word. How on earth is any upstart candidate going to defeat an incumbent if campaign messaging is banned from social media?"

When it comes to election advertising, one aspect to remember is how much money candidates spend on them. The Trump and Clinton campaigns spent a whopping \$81 million on political ads in 2016, a pittance relative to Facebook's \$27 billion in sales. And the results for this year are much more shocking. Because of all the moderators hired to root out electoral manipulation from international parties, Mark Zuckerberg also claimed that Facebook would lose money advertising campaign advertisements.



As we all know, America is filled with challenges and injustices, and the fact that political parties in the United States waste too much money on advertisements is concerning. It is however, also not surprising. Personally, I believe that these commercials are a perfect way to reach out to people, but they do have a number of drawbacks. Thousands of targeted social network ads are paired with donation connections form a never-ending propaganda system. Politicians may use frightening lies to manipulate disadvantaged demographics, resulting in more money to purchase more advertising.

Political ads come with its advantages and drawbacks whether you dislike or like them. These social media platforms may continue the pattern of banning and then reversing the ban of campaign ads throughout the years. I mean who knows? What's your stance on the regulation of political advertising?

WHAT WE CAN EXPECT FROM NASA'S PERSEVERANCE

On February 18th, 2021, NASA's newest rover, Perseverance, touched down on the surface of Mars after a 470 million kilometre journey. Perseverance is a 1-ton rover that's roughly the size of a small car. It's solar powered and will navigate its way over the Martian landscape with the help of six wheels. As its NASA's latest project and carries a rather hefty cost of 2.7 billion USD, many are interested in what the rover will aim to accomplish during its time on the red planet. Here are the key details on Perseverance's mission!

Perseverance's primary task is to search for signs of life. Previous NASA missions have determined that the red planet once held liquid water and fostered conditions that could potentially have supported earth-like organisms. Accordingly, Perseverance was programmed to land in Mars' Jezero crater, an impact site that was once a lake. The crater contains carbonate mineral deposits, which could conceal evidence of life. Additionally, the rover will search the lakebed for fossils. Perseverance is equipped with cameras mounted to its robotic arm that can detect tiny impressions in rocks. It also has a radar system that can detect water up to 10 meters underground. Particularly interesting samples will be collected and encased in tubes, which will be left on the surface of Mars and returned to Earth at a later date.

Furthermore, Perseverance is carrying technology that will help scientists to better understand the practicalities of living on Mars. For instance, the rover landed with a drone called Ingenuity, which will fly around Mars for thirty days and collect data on the feasibility of flying other such devices on the red planet. The rover also contains microphones that will collect and transmit the first-ever audio clips recorded on Mars. Additionally, it has a device that will collect carbon dioxide from the air and convert it into oxygen, paving the way for systems that will provide eventual human visitors with breathable air.

With any luck, Perseverance will contribute to many interesting discoveries, and it's exciting to think about what NASA may uncover next.

MEGHAN MARKLE AND PRINCE HARRY'S INTERVIEW with Oprak Wingfrey

Meghan Markle and Prince Harry recently announced that they have chosen to distance themselves from the Royal family, after leaving their roles nearly two years ago. Their interview, with their close friend and neighbour Oprah Winfrey, reveals the hardships they have faced within the Royal family. They discussed Prince Harry's strained relationship with Prince William and Prince Charles, and the disinformation that falsely claimed that Duchess Meghan made Kate Middleton cry prior to the royal wedding. Most significantly, Meghan, the Duchess of Sussex, revealed the Royal family's concern about her son's skin colour, taking away security protection from her family, and his son's lack of a royal title. She states she experienced oppressive racism and discrimination within the palace, which led to a decline in her mental health. Meghan, so courageously revealed her constant suicidal thoughts during her pregnancy with her first son Archie. She spoke about how life within the Royal family was consistently isolating and lonely, which made her feel extremely unsupported by the institution. When looking for guidance, she was silenced, due to the stigma around mental health in the institution, despite the many mental health events they have hosted.





The family was trapped, all experiencing severe mental health issues, not having anyone to turn to that fully understood their life circumstances. Throughout their time in the UK, they had a lack of support and understanding from the family, including Meghan not being taught their ways, and being cut off financially. Markle reveals she and her husband were not protected, but the Royal family was willing to lie to protect other members of the institution.



Buckingham Palace issued a brief statement on behalf of the Queen, who did not take accountability and stated these issues would be handled privately. The couple is receiving immense criticism worldwide, but specifically from the Royal family, including Prince Albert, Prince Charles, Prince William, Kate Middleton, and Queen Elizabeth II. Prince Albert found the couple's "public display of dissatisfaction" inappropriate, although he "can understand the pressure that they were under." He believes "these types of conversations should be held within the intimate quarters of the family." While Prince Charles has not given an official statement, it is clear he is upset about the interview. He also believes this should have been handled privately, scared that this is "the first of many interviews coming in the future that will bash the crown and the royals' way of life." Additionally, Prince William is devastated, claiming they are not a racist family, having yet to speak to his brother since the interview. Kate Middleton has not responded to Markle's comment about the false claims of Megan making her cry during the week of wedding preparations. William and Kate professed they did not know the extent to which the couple struggled, both agreeing that this should have been handled privately. Shockingly enough, Queen Elizabeth II has forbidden palace staff from getting involved in the aftermath of the interview and opened up communication lines between herself, and Meghan and Harry. No other members of the royal family have yet to respond to the major step Prince Harry and Meghan Markle have made. Who will be next to respond?



AMANDA GORMAN: AN INSPIRING ICON OF activism & SUCCESS

Poet. Activist. Author. Wielder of words.

Amanda Gorman, the sixth and youngest inaugural poet in US history, has gained worldwide attention for her moving and powerful recital of her poem at the recent presidential inauguration. In light of the harrowing invasion of the U.S capitol a few weeks before her performance, Amanda's speech provided a beacon of hope for many young black Americans. In an interview with CNN, she specified that her poem was inspired by the recent events saying "We've seen a force that would shatter our nation rather than share it... While democracy can be periodically delayed, it can never be permanently defeated." She also found inspiration from respected American leaders, Abraham Lincoln and Martin Luther King Jr, who performed speeches during grueling circumstances. Her poem, called "The Hill We Climb," shares a narrative of political strife, injustice, and despair, but ends with redemption, hope, and determination.



Achievements:

While Amanda Gorman is widely known for her inauguration speech, she has several other impressive accomplishments under her belt. The activist and poet graduated from Harvard University where she studied sociology. In 2017, she was presented with the title of the National Youth Poet Laureate. The title was appointed by Urban Word, a program supporting Youth Poets Laureate in several regions of the world. She has also received many awards for her writing, including the Poets & Writers Barnes & Noble Writers for Writers Award and the Genius Grant from OZY Media. Additionally, she sets the record for being, yet again, the youngest board member of 826 National, an organization dedicated to youth writers.

After the inauguration, she has performed for accomplished figures such as Lin-Manuel Miranda, Al Gore, Hillary Clinton, and Malala Yousafzai. Amanda even went on to write for Nike's Black History Month campaign and the New York Times newsletter. To add to her notable list of accomplishments, Amanda also wrote her first children's book called "Change Sings," and published a poetry collection including "The Hill We Climb." Her book reminds children to make use of their capabilities, urging them to use their voice to evoke change in the world. Similarly, her poetry collection focuses on the theme of hope and healing.

Early Life & Past Struggles:

Despite her countless achievements at a young age, Amanda's success was not handed to her on a silver platter; she shares with the world many struggles that have shaped her into the person she is today. Born in 1998 in Los Angeles and raised by a single mother, Amanda started writing at a very young age. She battled with a speech impediment in her younger years, stating that she used to be "that skinny girl with a speech impediment who needed a mentor." However, in an interview with Oprah, she expresses that she does not view her speech impediment as a weakness or a disability, but rather, one of her greatest strengths as a writer. She also shared that one of her icons, Maya Angelou, struggled with speech complications as well. Upon learning this, Angelou's books became even more so a source of hope in her life.

Later on, as a junior in high school, Amanda joined an organization called WriteGirl which introduced teenage girls to female writers who would become their mentors. Amanda's mentor, Dinah Berland, is a poet and editor in L.A who had seen Amanda perform at the Museum of Contemporary Art for the first time. In an interview, she commented on Amanda's incredible way with words, saying that "she was far superior to any of the other kids in terms of her ability, not only her reading, but her writing."

As Berland noted, Amanda's refined, fierce, and insightful approach to her writing has drawn a large audience towards her passion for justice, representation, and revolution. The powerful words she spoke on the day of Joe Biden's inauguration will not be forgotten by millions of people around the world; the words of a young, black woman with the desire and ability to initiate change in her community, her nation, and the world.

THREE inspiring WOMEN YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW ABOUT

It is important for young girls to see women making an impact in the world so that they are inspired to do the same. We know of the amazing women like Serena Williams, Michelle Obama, Malala Yousafzai, and countless others, who have changed the world forever, however, it is also important to acknowledge the other women who do so much but are not talked about enough.

Dr. Courtney Howard

Dr. Courtney Howard is an emergency doctor in Yellowknife, Northwest Territories, and she has been dedicated to researching the effects climate change has on human health. She is recognized nationally and globally as an expert on the impacts of climate change on healthcare. She became involved in this issue after speaking to many of her Indigenous patients who revealed to her that climate change has caused their landscape to change rapidly thus affecting their food security and physical safety on land. She realized she could kill two birds with one stone, help save the planet and save people's lives as well. Dr. Howard worked with Doctors Without Borders for 6 months in 2010 in Djibouti, where she treated many malnourished children, but sadly many of them died. Being a mother herself, this greatly impacted her and drove her to work to change the situation and stop preventable child deaths.. Then, after the extreme wildfires in 2014 in the Northwest Territories, Dr. Howard studied the impacts the wildfire smoke had on people, which was funded by Health-Canada. She said in an interview that "Climate change increases the risk and the frequency of wildfires. Their impacts of our communities can be devastating, as demonstrated in this new study. As healthcare providers, we need to be more aware of the growing threats posed by climate change on our health and the subsequent potential burden on our already overcrowded healthcare services". She treated many people who were suffering from smoke inhalation and knew that this problem would only get worse if it did not get treated.

Dr. Howard also led studies on menstrual products and their effect on climate change. She found that tampons and pads are left in dumps and do not break down and that cups are much better for the environment and more comfortable for many women. Dr. Howard also became the first female president of CAPE, Canadian Association of Physicians for the Environment, in 2017.

She became the lead author of the Lancet Countdown report in 2017-2019, which tracked how the world was responding to climate change, and used this to persuade Canadian lawmakers to create change to tackle the issues at hand. Last year, when the first wave of coronavirus hit, Dr. Howard was inspired to get involved and ran for the leadership position of the Green Party to replace Elizabeth May. She raised over \$140,000 for her campaign and ended up coming in third. After the second wave hit, she thought it best to return to her clinical work in the ER and use her national and alobal leadership roles to promote more health recovery. Dr. Courtney Howard is inspiring because she is an advocate for human health and the environment, which is a role that not many people take on.



Kawennáhere Devery Jacobs

Kawennáhere Devery Jacobs is an actress, writer, and director from Kanien'kehá:ka in Mohawk Territory in Quebec. She had a passion for acting from a young age and on her reserve there was a community theatre called Turtle Island Theatre Company where she performed. Her mother was very supportive and even sent in her resume to an agency in Quebec that accepted her. Jacobs went to John Abbott College in Montreal to be a counsellor and after she graduated, she worked at the Native Women's Shelter in Montreal. She knew that she had to be prepared to have a stable career in case acting did not work out. Nevertheless, while she was working at the shelter, she was cast in a leading role as Alia in "Rhymes for Young Girls". The writer/director was Indigenous and Jacobs was able to relate the story to herself which is why she was very excited for the role. She was nominated for Performance by an Actress in a Leading Role in the Canadian Screen Awards in 2014 for her role in "Rhymes for Young Girls". She worked on many films and television shows after that. She won Best Actor for her role in "The Sun at Midnight" in the Whistler Film Festival in 2016 and won best actress for the same movie in the American Indian Film Festival in 2017. Jacobs also wrote, directed and produced her own film. It was a short film called "Stolen" which was released in October of 2016 and is available to watch on Amazon Prime. It is about a 14 year old girl who runs away from her group home. IMDb describes it as "a small glimpse into a typical Native girl's life before becoming one of 1200+ Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women in Canada."

Jacobs identifies as queer and she says she has to deal with many microagressions from people due to prejudice around her identity as a gueer Indigenous individual. She shares that this external pressure made it a necessity to build up a wall of defense that protects her from this aggression. She is extremely proud of her culture and says, "I have to go in knowing that, because there isn't anybody who looks like me or has a similar cultural background, that I have to represent so much more than just myself." She loves doing movies about Indigenous culture but sometimes she likes to do projects that are just for fun with less cultural meaning to them.




Kawennáhere Devery Jacobs

Dr. Eugenia Duodu is the CEO of Visions of Science Network for Learning which helps kids from low-income communities get involved in STEM programs, hoping to spark some interest and guide the kids through it. Sometimes kids from these communities are not granted the same opportunities as others because of economic, social and system issues and Dr. Duodu wants to break these barriers Visions of Science Network for Learning has a small staff and over 120 volunteers, and it helps over 700 youth across the GTA.

She has an HB.Sc in Chemistry and Biology and also has a PhD in Chemistry which she earned at the University of Toronto. When she was in high school, she was told by a teacher about a summer mentorship program that the University of Toronto ran for students of Indigenous and African ancestry. The program brought students who were interested in similar things could come together, and when Dr. Duobu was accepted, it helped fuel her passion even more for science.

Dr. Duodu is committed to having equitable education so that children can get to their full potential because she believes in the future of the world, and believes the future lies with the success of children. Dr. Duodu has experienced sexism and racism, and has overcome both to get to the position she is at right now. Once, her guidance counselor told her that science would be too difficult for her and that she should go into cosmetology instead, even though she expressed an interest in science. She believed it was due to her race and gender, but she did not listen to the counselor, and decided to pursue her dream. She grew up in a Toronto community housing complex with her mom. Her mom supported her in her studies and never let her believe that she wasn't able to do anything she could put her mind to. A fun fact is Dr. Duodu grew up watching Bill Nye the Science Guy which was her only real exposure to science when she was young. People now still watch the show because it shows science in the most entertaining way possible. Dr. Duodu was a finalist for the 2020 Canadian Women Entrepreneur Awards in the Social Changes category. Dr. Duodu said, "I'm passionate about science and teaching others about it. Being able to inspire kids on a daily basis about something I'm passionate about is really cool." Dr. Eugenia Duodu is a role model for all little girls who have been told they can't do something based on their gender or appearance. She is an inspiration and demonstrates that if you are truly passionate about something, you can do it as long as you put in the work. It is also amazing to see her giving back to the community and helping children get the opportunities that she was not able to receive.

The Rise Fall and Rise Again of 2011 NBA MVP BY KEVIN DANIEL AND ASHWIN KRISHNATHASAN, GRADE 12


Derrick Rose was arguably the best player in the NBA at one point in time, but due to injuries his career took a sharp turn downwards, he lost his greatest asset and seemed to be at the lowest point in his career. Recently Rose has gotten much better and seems to have found his place in a playoff team. An underdog loved by fans all around the world, this is the story of Derrick Rose.

Born in Southside Chicago to a single mother, he lived with his three brothers in a rough neighbourhood. Rose began playing basketball at a young age and with the help of his three brothers his skills began to sharpen and his potential became incredibly evident. By his final year in high school, he was considered the best high school point guard in the country, and eventually was recruited by the University of Memphis in 2007. In his first and only season with the school, he was able to lead the team to a 38 and 2 record and in the playoffs was able to storm through the competition, eventually losing in the finals to the Kansas Jayhawks.

The same year Rose signed up for the NBA draft and was selected first overall by his hometown team, the Chicago Bulls. His first season with the Bulls was an incredible success, Rose averaged nearly 17 points with 6 assists a game on an incredibly efficient 48% field goal percentage. Rose was able to lead the Bulls to the seventh seed when in the playoffs they faced off against the Boston Celtics, an incredibly powerful team that had just won the championship the year before. In his first-ever playoff game, Rose dropped 36 points, the most ever by a rookie in the first round. The Bulls were very close to upsetting the former champion Celtics, but lost in the final game of the series. Although the loss stung, this entire season showed the immense potential Rose had, with him going on to win the Rookie of the Year and All-Rookie First Team. The next season Rose had gotten even better, averaging nearly 21 points with 6 assists on 50% field goal percentage. Rose was able to earn his first All-Star appearance and lead his team to the eighth seed, barely edging out the Raptors for the spot by a single win.



The playoffs were much more anti-climatic, with the Bulls losing to the Lebron led Cleveland to win in 5 games. Rose's third season with the Bulls was the most iconic season, this was the season he said his famous quote while being questioned about future goals and expectations, "(The expectation) is high. The way I look at it in myself is why not? Why can't I be the MVP of the league? Why can't I be the best player in the league? I don't see why. Why can't I do that? I think I work hard, I think I dedicate myself to the game and sacrifice a lot of things at a young age and I know that if I continue to - like - do good what I can get out of it. And that's me now, doing whatever. I'm willing to do it because I know in the long run it's going to help," Rose said. This is the season where Rose truly proved himself to be one of the greatest players in the league, averaging 25 points and 8 assists a game on 49% field goal percentage, and helped lead the team to the first seed in the league, from 41-41 last year, to 62-20 this year. This incredible performance was seen by the world and Rose was awarded the 2011 NBA MVP trophy, and was labeled the youngest player to ever win the MVP. In the playoffs, the Bulls were able to knock out the Indiana Pacers in the first round in 5 games.

In the second round (and Rose's first time getting out of the first round) the Bulls were able to beat the Atlanta Hawks in 6 games and eventually ended up in the Eastern Conference Finals against the Miami Heat and their big three of Lebron James, Dwyane Wade and Chris Bosh. Although they put up a valiant effort, the Bulls ended up losing in 5 games to the Heat. This would be Rose's best year, and his career slowly started a downward spiral after this.

In 2012, Rose averaged 22 points and 8 assists on 48% field goal percent, the Bulls were the first seed yet again, but this time during the playoffs something terrible occurred. During the first round of the first game against the Philadelphia 76ers, in the final minutes of the game, Rose was coming down from a jump and landed awkwardly on his leg, falling to the ground and clenching his leg. It turned out to be a torn ACL and caused him to miss the rest of the playoffs.

Without Rose, the Bulls were defeated in an upset by the 8th seed 76ers and the Bulls season came to an end. During the 2012-2013 season, Rose sat out for the entire season while recovering from the injury, and when he returned for the 2013-2014 season he was a shell of his former self. His final years with the Bulls were uneventful as well as filled with mediocrity and injuries, with the only glimmer of hope being in 2015 when Rose and the Bulls went head to head with Lebron and the Cavs in the second round, with the Bulls eventually losing in 6 games.

After the 2016 season, the Bulls front office decided to trade Rose to the New York Knicks and despite the outrage from the Bulls' fanbase, Rose was traded. He was devastated by the news, as Chicago was his home and he put his heart and soul into the team. Rose's year with the Knicks was underwhelming, averaging 18 points on 47% efficiency, and eventually had a season-ending injury with a torn meniscus. He was then signed to the Cleveland Cavaliers but, after 16 games was traded to the Utah Jazz, where he was immediately waived. This entire situation had really affected Rose's mental health, who wondered if he'd ever be the same again and even contemplated retirement.

Towards the end of the season, he eventually signed with the Minnesota Timberwolves, where he played decently well for the last couple games, averaging 14 points in 23 minutes, but his comeback story starts in the 2018-2019 season, where we were able to see flashes of his old self, with many new skills he sharpened over the years. On October 31st 2018, Rose went off and dropped a sensational 50 points, achieving a new career high. The night was incredibly emotional for everybody, especially after proving to many doubters that he still had the talent. Rose went on to average 18 points on 52% and became a solid player that any team would want. Rose then signed with the Detroit Pistons during the 2018-2019 season, and averaged 18 points on the most efficient scoring he's ever done with 52% efficiency. During the 2020 season Rose was eventually traded to a true playoff team, and in ironic fashion, the team he was traded to was the same team he got traded to back in his Chicago Bull days, but this time around he had Knicks as one of his destinations he would like to go if he was ever traded. Currently the Knicks are the 5th seed, playing the best basketball they've ever had in a long time, and Derrick Rose has been an incredibly crucial part for that position. Rose's comeback proved that anything is possible as long as you put your mind to it, coming back from many trials and tribulations. He looked adversity straight in the eyes and never flinched, truly an inspiration for everyone fighting their own battles.

For those who are unaware, the Olympics is a multi-sport event celebrated by countries all over the globe. These games take place both in the summer and winter, and their initial goal is to promote peace through unity of different nations. The Olympics started 2,800 years ago in Olympia, Greece and was referred to as the Olympiad. These games unfortunately came to an end in 393 AD due to multiple conflicts within the community. His vision for a united world was such a notable movement that he fathered the term "Olympism" which refers to overcoming differences between various cultures and promoting peace. This philosophy still exists today through the IOC organization, who promote betterment between nations and recognize nearly 205 countries and regions.

This year's Olympics will take place in Tokyo for the second time, adding to the overall count of four olympics being held in Asia. Tokyo first hosted this event in Kasumigaoka stadium marking the first ever Olympics hosted in Asia. Around 5,000 athletes attended the event from nearly 93 regions who partook in 163 events in about 20 sporting competitions. Due to the games being hosted in Tokyo, Tokyo's experienced major economic growth as large express routes such as the Metropolitan expressway were constructed.



The Olympics at the time also promoted sports within Japan, eventually making sports an important part for many in their daily lives. The 2020 Tokyo games was set to introduce many new ideas within the summer Olympics. Skateboarding, karate, surfing and sport climbing are all new events that were set to be introduced within the 2020 event. The Tokyo organization also reported a new statistic of the first ever gender-balanced Olympics with a large number of female Paralympic participants.
